

How to Create, Request, or Host Public Art in Kerrville

Kerrville takes pride in its growing public art scene—a reflection of our vibrant community, creative spirit, and the natural beauty of the Texas Hill Country. If you're an artist, business owner, or community member interested in contributing to or hosting public art in Kerrville, we're here to guide you through the process.

1. Submit a Public Art Proposal

Whether you're a local artist with a bold new idea or an organization looking to enhance a public space, submitting a proposal is the first step. The City of Kerrville and the Kerrville Public Art Committee (KPAC) review all submissions to ensure they align with the city's values and aesthetic goals.

Your proposal should include:

- A detailed description of the concept
- Visual mock-ups or sketches
- Preferred location(s)
- Materials and installation needs
- Timeline and budget (if applicable)

Pro Tip: Consider how your artwork will interact with its environment and contribute to the broader community experience.

2. Request Public Art for Your Property

Are you a business or property owner interested in hosting a mural or sculpture? Public art can elevate your space, attract foot traffic, and create a lasting impression. You can request to be considered as a host site through the KPAC, who will help match you with artists and navigate any city permissions needed.

Requirements may include:

- Property owner approval
- Space specifications and photos

- Long-term maintenance agreement

3. Partner on a Community Art Project

Community-driven art projects—like collaborative murals or temporary installations—are a great way to bring people together. If you're part of a nonprofit, school, or civic group, consider partnering with local artists or applying for a grant through Kerrville's public art initiatives.

4. Follow the Guidelines

To maintain quality and ensure safety, all public art installations must follow city regulations and design standards. KPAC can provide guidance on materials, themes, historical considerations, and installation logistics.
